CLEANLINESS DRIVE EVENT GENERATED AT ESIC MODEL HOSPITAL & PGIMSR
BASAIDARAPUR ON 01.10.2023**

On the occasion of Swachhata Hi Seva, an initiative of Govt of India under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji, a cleanliness drive was carried out at ESIC Model Hospital & PGIMSR Basaidarapur on 01.10.2023 between 10:00AM to 11:00AM under the campaign banner "*Ek Tareekh, Ek Ghanta, Ek Saath*". The drive was attended by several prominent members of ESIC Hqrs and Basaidarapur hospital including Dr. Mona Verma, DMC(ICT), Dr. Madhu Gupta, DMC(Medical Services), Dr. Sanjay Mishra, Medical Superintendent, Dr. Paschal D'Souza, Nodal Officer (Swachhata Campaign) & Off. There was enthusiastic participation in this voluntary Shramdan by hospital staff members including from administration, nursing, paramedical, doctors and PG students. Attendants of indoor patients, public from outside hospital and media personnel from Punjab kesari leading to a total of more than 100 participants.

At the outset, the gathering was addressed by the Medical Superintendent who emphasized the importance of cleanliness drive and thanked all the volunteers who came to participate in the event.

All the volunteers who offered Shramdan were divided into 2 teams:- Team 1 – Cleaned the garden and lawn area in front of the Administration block and Team 2 – Cleaned a rectangular stretch of area extending from Gate No.1 to Gate No. 2. The activity included sweeping the area, picking-up plastics & Paper wastes, dried leaves, twigs and arranging the disordered construction materials present at the site in a proper dedicated area. All the waste was picked up in green and blue polybags and was dumped in 2 large pick-up trucks which carried the waste away from the campus site. All the participants behaved responsibly. Water bottles bought by volunteers and also provided by hospital administration were disposed in proper dustbins, thus leaving the area clean and without any litter after the campaign. After the cleaning was complete in the designated event area, plantation of few saplings were done by senior administrative officers from Hqrs and Hospital in the front lawn area of the administrative block.

The cleanliness drive event between 10:00AM – 11:00AM under the campaign banner "*Ek Tareekh, Ek Ghanta, Ek Saath*" was concluded successfully at 11:00AM and it infused a spirit of community service among all participants and promoted the idea of keeping our workplace clean.
